We connect counsellors worldwide so that they can share information and participate in international Practice, Education, Advocacy, Policy and Research counselling projects The President, Executive Council (EC) and Annual General Meeting
Term	Three Years
Purpose of role:	 To further the IAC strategic aims Members-at-large will have various responsibilities and projects – short or long-term – during their elected term To take part in sub committees to focus in detail on a particular issue or function for the Executive Council
Description of tasks:	 Participate in IAC sub-committees to focus in detail on a particular issue or function for the Executive Council To attend, and assist at, the Annual Conferences and General Meetings where possible. Encourage membership through promotion of IAC at counselling events and through counselling contacts and networks. To attend meetings of the Executive Council (approximately 6 per year). To report on developments in their areas of responsibility.
Time Commitment:	 Reading /Preparation time of 1.5 hours for six online Executive Council meetings lasting approximately two (2) hours each. Approximately 1.5 hours per week allocated to described tasks (above), e.g. sub-committee work. Attend the annual conference (including all meetings, this takes up approximately one week), where viable. Flexibility around time is needed to respond to the needs

	of the organization.
	*With the exception of a face-to-face meeting at the Annual Conference, all meetings are conducted virtually.
Eligibility Criteria	 Be a member in good standing of IAC for a minimum of one (1) year immediately prior to nomination. Have previous experience of organisational leadership. Have had no ethical violations for the past three (3) consecutive years immediately prior to nomination
Skills and Qualifications:	 Good leadership skills and initiative Understanding of and commitment to the organisation's mission & values. Good communication and interpersonal skills.
Training and Support:	New members of the Council will be offered an on-line Induction and pairing with an experienced Council member for Skype meetings
