Term	Three Years
Purpose of role:	To represent IAC and its values and to develop knowledge of
	counselling in their region.
Description of tasks:	To encourage membership through promotion of IAC at
	regional counselling events and through counselling
	contacts and networks.
	 To map and monitor counselling activity in their region.
	 To report on regional counselling developments.
	 To attend meetings of the EC (approximately 6 per year)
	 To take part in regional sub-committee work
	(approximately 6 meetings per year).
	To conduct IAC outreach and develop a regional
	counselling network in your world region.
Time Commitment:	 Reading /Preparation time of 1.5 hours for six online
