ROLE TITLE:	IAC Research and Outreach Coordinator
Responsible to:	IAC Research and Outreach Team Leader
Term	An initial commitment of two years is sought
Role Summary:	IAC Research and Outreach Coordinators play a pivotal role in advancing IAC's mission by conducting in-depth research, fostering community engagement, and managing outreach initiatives. This position is designed for a dynamic individual with a passion for counselling, and who has excellent communication skills. The coordinator will support the association's goals by developing and executing strategies that promote awareness, collaboration, and growth within the global counselling community.
Volunteer Hours:	120 150 hours annually
Time Commitment	This works out as approximately two hours per week plus meetings.
	From time-to-time additional meetings may be required.
Duties Include:	 Gather comprehensive information on the counselling profession, including lists of counselling associations, educational institutions offering counselling programs, and counselling services/centres in specific countries/regions, and compile this information in an agreed-upon format. Encourage collaboration and membership through proactive outreach to groups and individuals. Cultivate and maintain relationships with potential and current members to foster a supportive and engaged community. Promote volunteerism among counsellors within the country/region to support the association's initiatives and enhance community involvement. Maintain and update databases and records accurately, ensuring that all information is current and accessible. Produce regular reports related to outreach activities, and research findings to support decision-making and strategic planning.

	 Suggest and implement improvements to research and outreach processes to enhance efficiency and effectiveness. Undertake any other duties approved by the Team Leader that align with the role and support the overall mission of the association.
Meetings:	 Approximately six, 1.5 hour membership meetings per year. Approximately two, 1.5hour volunteering meetings per year. *All meetings are conducted virtually
Skills and Qualifications:	 Must be aged over 18 Excellent interpersonal and communication skills. Minimum of 3-5 years of experience in research, outreach, or a related role, preferably within a mental health or non-profit organization. Organised, conscientious and attentive to details. Some administrative experience. Technological know-how, including MS Word and Excel. Database management experience a plus. Understanding of and commitment to IAC's mission & values.
Personal Attributes: Support and Training:	 It is essential that volunteers have the following attributes/skills: Caring, sensitive and empathetic to all people regardless of their nationality, age, gender, sexual orientation, disability, ethnic origin, culture or faith. Willingness to participate in appropriate training and learning. Understand the importance of confidentiality & observing policies and procedures. Able to work independently or as part of a team Reliable and punctual. Training will be provided as required. This will include an online induction and demonstration of the tasks. Volunteers will be supported by the IAC volunteer coordinators and the person in charge of their volunteers or project staff.
Volunteering Location	All volunteers work 'virtually' i.e. from their own country and computing base (e.g. home computer/personal device). Work times are completely flexible.

Benefits to the Research and Outreach Coordinator:	 Fulfillment – knowing that the support you provide will make a real difference to progressing IAC aims and making counselling available worldwide. Training – learning new skills that can be added to your CV, gaining up-to-date knowledge of counselling issues. Experience – meeting new people in different situations from around the world, building new networks, forming friendships with other IAC volunteers.
