Term	An initial commitment of two years is sought.
Role Summary	Researching and recording data and information on the
	counselling profession in selected countries and regions.
Volunteer Hours	2 Hours per Week This works out as approximately 120-150
Time Commitment	hours per year including meetings. From time to time attendance
	at additional meetings may be requested.
Duties Include	Duties will be agreed prior to placement but are likely to include
	some of the following:
	Gathering information on the counselling profession e.g.
	counselling associations, education institutes offering
	counsellor education programmes, and counselling services,
	regulatory status etc) in an agreed format.
	 Compiling selected/specific reports or lists of counselling
	information to aid communication with specific groups.
	Regular meetings: You will meet regularly (at least every
	two months) with the other volunteers on the project
	team.

	 Working towards in-depth knowledge of the mapping work.
	 Attend online meetings (Mapping and Volunteering)
	• Any other duties approved by the Team Leader.
Meetings	• Approximately eight, 1.5 hour project meetings per year.
	 Approximately six, 1.5hour volunteering meetings per year.

Support and Training	Training will be provided as required. This will include an online
	induction and demonstration of the tasks. Volunteers will be
	supported by their direct supervisor and the IAC Volunteer
	Coordinators (who recruit and support volunteers for all work
	areas).
Volunteering Location	All volunteers work 'virtually' i.e. from their own country and
	computing base (e.g. home computer/personal device).
