RATIONALE

- The internationalization of counselling continues to advance with new developments taking place to enhance the level of awareness, education, and practice that occurs throughout the world. The International Association for Counselling (IAC) remains a solid collaborative leader in the development of the profession globally, and ongoing studies have helped provide insight into ways mental health counselling can meet the needs of a variety of individuals, families, and groups of people.
- The webinar will explore the various ways in which the literature addressed a need for culturally competent counsellors, who exhibited various valued characteristics that include flexibility, creativity, tenacity and vision, as well as cultural humility, a desire to learn, and a willingness to step away from a traditional ethnocentric view of counselling as often demonstrated in Western counselling strategies. Current research endeavours will be described related to international counselling, with careful attention to specific studies that addressed ways of conceptualizing the most valued traits counsellors possess across cultures, the values experienced in counselling across cultures, and the insights international counselling professionals are able to provide.
