Meetings:	 Approximately six, 1.5-hour fundraising team meetings per year. *All meetings are conducted virtually
Skills and Qualifications:	 Must be aged over 18 Excellent interpersonal and communication skills. Organised, conscientious and attentive to details. Some administrative experience. Database management (Excel / Google Drive) experience a plus. Understanding of and commitment to the organisation's mission & values. Ability to work on own initiative. Willingness to learn new skills.
